# OFFSHORE WIND PROPOSALS AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC REVIEW

(NEWARK, NJ) – The New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (NJBPU) today announced the five proposals that were submitted for the New Jersey Offshore Wind Solicitation Grant are now available for public perusal.

The five proposals received include:

- 1. Environmental Technologies, LLC
- 2. Fishermen's Energy of New Jersey, LLC
- 3. Garden State Offshore Energy
- 4. Occidental Development & Equities, LLC
- 5. Bluewater Wind

The Solicitation sought proposals to install a maximum aggregate capacity of 350 MW in offshore renewable electricity generating technology at the economic terms and environmental performance most advantageous to the New Jersey ratepayer and taxpayer. A maximum grant award of \$19 million was offered with as much as 10 percent available in pre-construction funds and the remainder to be paid based upon production of electricity. Funding has been budgeted in the New Jersey Clean Energy Program (NJCEP)'s 2008 Renewable Energy budget with payment to be processed through a cooperative agreement with the New Jersey Economic Development Authority (NJEDA).

The Evaluation Committee is comprised of voting and non-voting members including individuals that bring a wide variety of skills and disciplines necessary to evaluate the grant proposals. It includes representatives of the Governor's Office, New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP), the New Jersey Commerce Tourism and Economic Development Commission (Commerce), members of the Division of Energy, Office of the Economist and the Office of Clean Energy from the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities – as well as national experts on offshore wind from the National Renewable Energy Laboratory and U.S. Department of Interior. Committee members are currently involved in the evaluation process and meet as needed to discuss and score the proposals.

The Evaluation Committee will develop an award recommendation based upon review of the proposals that will be presented to the Board. The committee will seek to reach a consensus decision as to which respondent(s), if any, are to be recommended to the Board for contract award. The Committee's work concludes with the Board's acceptance of its report, containing the recommendations regarding grant award. Following an extension that was approved at the July 30<sup>th</sup> Agenda Meeting, the Board now is expected to be presented with the Evaluation Committee's recommendation at its regularly scheduled meeting on October 2, 2008.
