**New Jersey Board of Public Utilities joins the New Jersey Meadowlands Commission to Announce Major Solar Project**  
*New Jersey's Clean Energy Program™ Advances Renewable Energy Goals*

- WHO:** New Jersey leaders including Jeanne M. Fox, President of the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (BPU), Joseph Doria, Chairman of the New Jersey Meadowlands Commission (NJMC) and Robert Ceberio, NJMC Executive Director
- WHAT:** Announce the scope of the NJMC's major new solar landfill project
- WHEN:** Wednesday, March 25, 11:30 a.m.
- WHERE:** One DeKorte Plaza, Lyndhurst, NJ 07071, in front of the NJMC Center for Environmental and Scientific Education
- HOW:** With financial incentives from the BPU, the NJMC is announcing a major renewable energy project combining redevelopment and ground-mounted solar power. Media attendees will learn the details of the new project, what it means to the state and how it fits in to both the national focus on energy issues and statewide goals to increase use of renewable energy.
- KEY VISUALS:** The Center for Environmental and Scientific Education, the first solar project completed by the NJMC, offers powerful visuals of key technologies. The building is a model for environmental responsibility with countertops and flooring made of recycled materials, solar panels and solar tubes that help light the building, and motion-activated lights that switch on and off when students enter and leave classrooms.
- WHY:** The goals of Governor Corzine's Energy Master Plan include reducing projected growth in energy use by 20 percent, decreasing peak electricity demand by 5,700 MW and meeting 30 percent of the state's electricity needs from renewable sources, all by 2020.
