



## **Renewable Energy Committee Meeting**

**October 9, 2013**

**BPU 1st Floor Meeting Room - Trenton, NJ**

**1:00 pm to 3:30 pm**

### **I. Introductions**

Ms. Lypse called the meeting to order at 1:08 pm. Attendees in the room and on the teleconference introduced themselves. Scott Hunter read the disclaimer above.

### **II. OCE Updates**

#### **a. Regulatory / Legislation Update**

Mr. Hunter said there were no legislative matters to report. He said that regulatory issues would be discussed later in the meeting by John Teague and Ron Jackson.

#### **b. Board Orders and Proceedings**

Mr. Hunter said that the Board's agenda for its meeting on October 16, 2013 would include:

- An item from the Energy Division to extend the 180-day review period for SREC-based financing programs for JCP&L, ACE & RECO by one additional month. This will allow the Board to vote on the programs at its November 22, 2013 agenda meeting.
- A request for the extension of a Subsection (q) motion for reconsideration filed by Innovative Technologies and Applications so it won't be denied due to exceeding the time limit.
- A petition filed by Paul and Gloria Van Houten for the waiver of the RPS regulations that require SRECs to be generated only by revenue grade meter data.
- As an interim measure, reopening the NJCEP's CHP/FC program with Board Staff managing the program for systems greater than 1 MW and TRC managing the program for systems less than 1 MW.

Mr. Hunter also reported that the following items were acted upon at the Board's September 18, 2013 agenda meeting:

- The Board granted two approvals – one of them conditional – for Subsection (t) applications (Zongyi and Solar Wind Energy). The Board found that the current definition of SREC

“qualification life” set forth in N.J.A.C. 14:2-2.2 does not reflect the two-pronged requirement for authorization to generate SRECs. Each direct grid supply project requires both board approval as connected to the distribution system and authorization to operate by the EDC. In the meantime, until the RPS rules are changed, the Board defined how these projects would be handled and that is described in the Order dated September 18, 2013.

- The Board extended some Purchase & Sale agreements in JCP&L’s SREC-based financing program.
- The Board approved a request for an extension of the Motion for Reconsideration for two agricultural projects that were filed under Subsection (t) but are not considered brownfield projects.

**c. Discussion of NJCEP Program Administrator RFP / Transition Status**

Betsy Ackerman said the protest filed against the contract award continues to be considered for resolution. She said Board Staff will recommend at the October 16<sup>th</sup> Board meeting that the current Market Manager and Program Coordinator contracts be extended through December 31, 2013.

**d. True up budget process**

Ms. Ackerman said the budget for the 18-month program year 2012-13 has not yet been trued up. She noted that the \$161 million that lapsed to the state budget must still be accounted for. The budget true up will be completed within a month and be considered at the December Board Agenda meeting.

**III. Update on the Solar Act**

**a. Subsection (q); Application process for Round 2**

Mr. Hunter reported that the Board, at its August 21, 2013 agenda meeting, approved 21 of the 28 projects submitted in the first application round in May, and directed Staff to conduct a second round. Mr. Hunter said Round 2 will be “a mirror image” of Round 1, although it will include the ability to retrieve escrow accounts before the project is designated. The Round 2 process begins on October 15; escrow must be funded by October 15; **the Board’s email address will open at exactly 4:00 pm on Tuesday, October 15<sup>th</sup>**. Emails will be rank-ordered by time of receipt. Applications must be submitted within five days. It was also announced that this would be the final round for subsection (q) grid supply projects.

There was a brief discussion between Mr. Hunter and a meeting attendee regarding the retrieval of escrow funds and the timing of the email account used for the application process (i.e., coordination of the BPU server with the World Clock).

In response to a question on the phone, Mr. Hunter said he expects Board staff to once again take 90 days to evaluate the Second Round Subsection (q) applications.

A meeting attendee asked if an applicant must sign the escrow agreement or whether a financial partner may do so. Mr. Hunter said he will address this question in the FAQs. In addition, the OCE was going to determine the process for refunding escrows for projects approved in subsection q that wanted to withdraw.

An issue was raised by the audience regarding the termination of the PJM Queue numbers for grid supply projects that had surpassed the expiration date of the PJM approval and were subsequently issued a new PJM queue number. Mr. Hunter responded that the Board approval of the project and the PJM number are independent from each other and the change in queue number will not affect the

Board's approval. The project registrant must provide a cover letter indicating the PJM queue number change for the SRP project.

Mr. Hunter was also asked about page 8 the "Subsection (q) Application Materials" document under section G: Certifications, item number "4" should be removed and number "5" item will become number "4". Mr. Hunter was going to look into that and revise it with the FAQs and send it all out immediately. (*These documents were sent out the day after the meeting, on Oct. 10<sup>th</sup>.*)

**b. Subsection (r); see RPS rulemaking agenda item VI.**

**c. Subsection (s); Board directive re: deferred applications**

Mr. Hunter said that Staff has not been able to act yet on comments received by September 5, 2013 regarding milestones. He said Staff will attempt to package the comments and develop recommendations in time for the Board's November 22, 2013 agenda meeting, but indicated that it may be deferred to the December 18, 2013 agenda meeting.

**d. Subsection (t); Actions resulting from the September Agenda meeting**

The Board granted two approvals – one of them conditional – for Subsection (t) applications (Zongyi and Solar Wind Energy).

**e. Investigating Approaches to Mitigate Solar Volatility**

Charlie Garrison presented data detailing the current amount of installed solar capacity, the amount of capacity in the pipeline, a breakdown of grid supply versus behind the meter projects, deactivations, SREC pricing data and solar generation scenarios.

- The installed solar capacity as of 9/30/13 is approximately 1,142.3 MW.
  - Approximately 8.0 MW were reported as completed in the current month.
- The preliminary solar capacity project pipeline as of 9/30/13 is approximately 354.4 MW.
  - The project pipeline decreased approximately 3 MW in the current month.

A comment was made by audience that the pipeline includes some duplicate grid supply projects – subsection (q) projects. Charlie Garrison stated that these will be cleaned up for next month's REC meeting.

Charlie Garrison also solicited input from stakeholders on how to best estimate the future installed capacity rates for Energy Year 2014 through 2016. Some of the discussion points included: 1) pick a growth percentage and apply it each year; 2) use 3 years forward, 6 months back approach; 3) use recent average of NJ retail electric sales data and consider using EIA data based on calendar years, prorated to EY structure to develop an estimate of retail electric sales for EY14 through EY16 ; and 4) refer to NJ econometric model to help inform the estimate of future retail electric sales.

Another point was made on the use of 1200 kWh/kW value being used in the current calculations for annual SREC generation and that it may have to be updated to reflect more recent value of 1300 kWh/kW per GATS data. Industry input on these items would improve the accuracy of the three scenarios that will be presented at future renewable energy committee meetings and in the month end reports.

#### **IV. Program Updates**

##### **a. Biopower working group update**

Mr. Reisman reported that the straw proposal for the FY2014 biopower solicitation was released on September 18, and a Biopower Working Group meeting was held on September 20 to review and discuss it. Written comments were received by October 7 from five organizations and individuals. The Market Manager is reviewing those comments and will develop a draft solicitation for the Board to consider at its November 22 agenda meeting.

##### **b. Energy Storage working group update**

Ms. Lypse said there will be another working group meeting held before Thanksgiving to start developing a straw proposal for the solicitation. She said the timetable calls for the solicitation to begin in Q1 of 2014, and indicated that an RFI will be issued in January 2014 to gauge potential interest.

##### **c. Operations Update**

Tammy Gray presented data detailing SRP Registration trends, Acceptance Letters issued and Final As-Built submittals.

#### **V. Update on Interconnection Issues**

Mr. Teague reminded everyone that the next Net Metering & Interconnection stakeholder meeting will be held at 10 am on November 1, 2013.

Mr. Teague also said that Staff was preparing Board Orders for the November 22, 2013 agenda meeting on the process for EDCs to scrub outdated interconnection applications for net metered projects in the project queue and for the modification of existing rules. He said Staff is also preparing an Order for the transfer of funding to the State Division of Fire Safety for firefighter training on solar systems.

#### **VI. RPS issues**

##### **a. Review the EY 13 RPS compliance process, NJ Class I and II results and Solar RPS preliminary calculation information.**

Mr. Jackson said that Class I and II data for EY2013 were due October 1, 2013. Total retail sales subject to the RPS for EY2013 is 76,962,195 MWhs. The Solar RPS is equal to 596,000 MWhs, and solar reports are due by December 1, 2013.

##### **b. Changes to RPS rulemaking**

Mr. Jackson noted that the Solar Act redefined Class I and II to include small hydro (<3MW) as Class I if the project was installed after the July 23, 2012 effective date of the Solar Act. He said the definition for Class II is expanded to include hydro >3 MW and up to 30 MW.

Mr. Jackson also noted that the Solar Act creates definitions for “connected to the distribution system”, “farmland” and “net metering aggregation”; changes the solar carve out from a fixed amount of MWh to a percentage of retail sales; adjusts SACP schedule; and extends the life of SRECs from 3 to 5 years.
