



2010 REIP and SRP Final Paperwork Checklist

In order for an installation to be deemed complete, receive an NJ Certification number, rebate check and instructions on how to register with the SREC or REC tracking system, the following requirements must be completed and submitted to the Market Manager team. Illegible documents will be returned to the applicant.

Rebate checks: After the NJ Certification Number is generated, rebate checks are processed in batches and reviewed by the BPU oversight committee. **Checks are mailed within 60 days of the date the batch is approved and submitted for payment.**
