

New Jersey's Clean Energy Program Update: Residential New Construction

The construction environment continues to rebound in New Jersey as we recover from the recession. The increase in activity across the state has been reflected in participation in the New Jersey Clean Energy Program. In the first two and a half months of Fiscal Year 2016 the Residential New Construction (RNC) Program has received over 6,000 requests for projects to be registered. We are excited about the increased interest in participating in the Residential New Construction Program and encouraged in the momentum building in energy efficient construction.

This unprecedented number of registration requests has expended the existing budget available to the Residential New Construction Program. Until funds are reallocated into the RNC Program, we will not be able to register any more projects. We are working together to develop a process moving forward that will enable fast track projects to continue to participate in the program. We will continue to communicate as we work through this. All other areas of the RNC Program will operate as normal during this time. The budget constraints only effect enrollment and reenrollment of projects.
